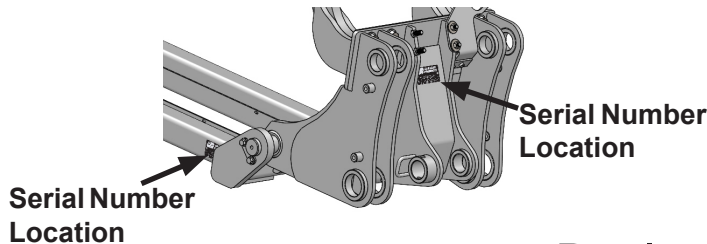

- Do not modify or permit anyone else to modify or alter the equipment and its components without first consulting Grouser Products.



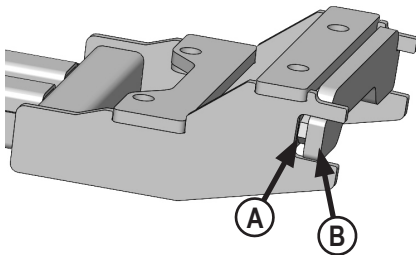
Note:

- When installing hardware, only finger tighten until all hardware is in place.
- A full diagram of the assembly with the full list of parts is on pages 6-7.
- Unstrap and remove any components that are attached for shipping.
- Read all instructions prior to performing installation.

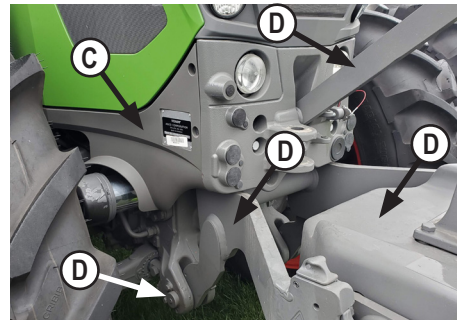


To ensure the safety of those working under and around the machine, apply parking brake, remove key from ignition, and block tires before working on the machine.

Pre-Installation



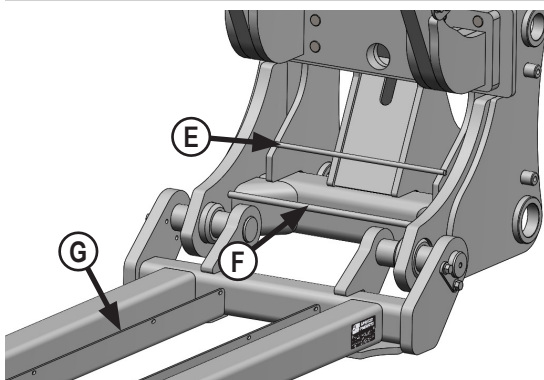
1. Install 1" x 2" bolts in threaded blocks at rear of undercarriage (A). Turn bolts all the way in for installation. The bolts will be adjusted in Step #27.
2. Install push plate as shown (B). If necessary, hold push plate in place with zip tie until rear undercarriage is installed.
3. At rear of tractor, pull drawbar out to allow room to install front support.



4. Remove the side shields (C).
5. If applicable, unplug and remove the electrical socket from the front of the tractor. It will be reinstalled in Step #32. The bracket can stay on the front plate.
6. Remove the front weights, front rigid arms, bottom and top pins and retaining hardware, and the top link (D).

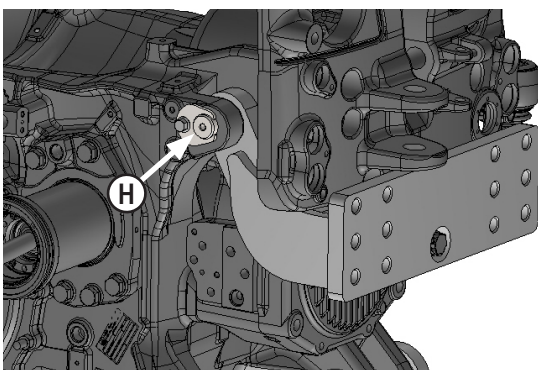
NOTE: The threaded hole on the bottom pin is for installing a 10mm x 1.5mm bolt to aid in pulling out the pin.

Installation



NOTE: If hoses were factory installed on undercarriage, proceed to Step #9.

7. Route hoses from the front of undercarriage under the first set of bars (E) and then over the bottom bar (F) on undercarriage.
8. Continue to route the hoses through the hose loops on front undercarriage (G).

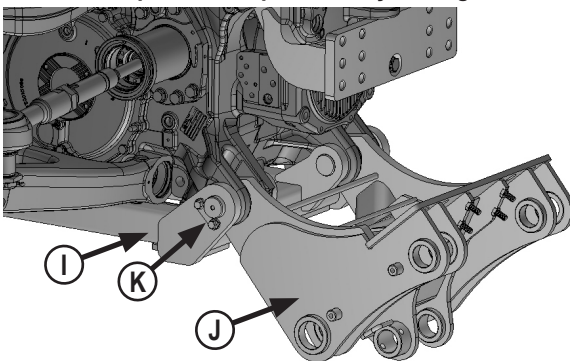


9. Install front master plate weld at front of tractor where original front rigid arms were removed from. Use original pins and hardware removed in Step #6 to attach to tractor frame (H).

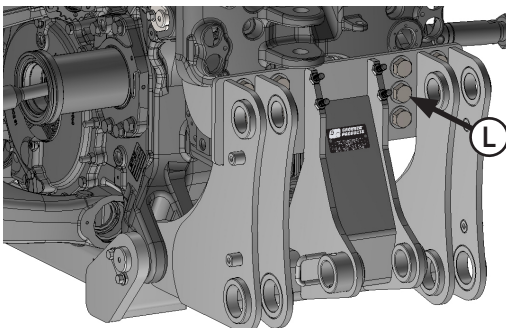
10. Center front undercarriage under tractor.



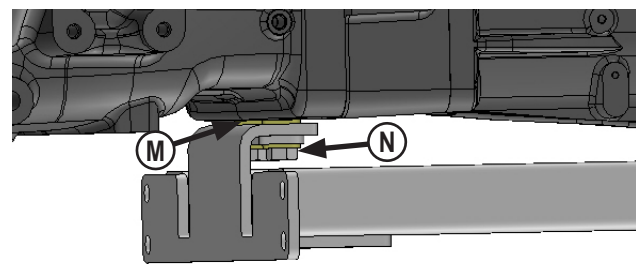
Caution: When lifting front and rear undercarriage, watch for potential pinching of hoses or other components to prevent any damage.



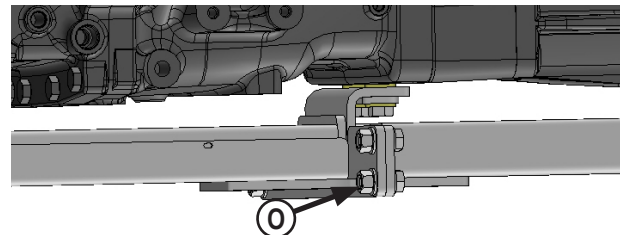
11. Raise front undercarriage (I) until it's ears line up with ears on tractor frame.
12. Raise undercarriage mount (J) until it's ears line up with ears on tractor frame.
13. Install new pins through outer front ears of front undercarriage, tractor frame and undercarriage mount. Secure with retaining hardware removed in Step #6 (K).



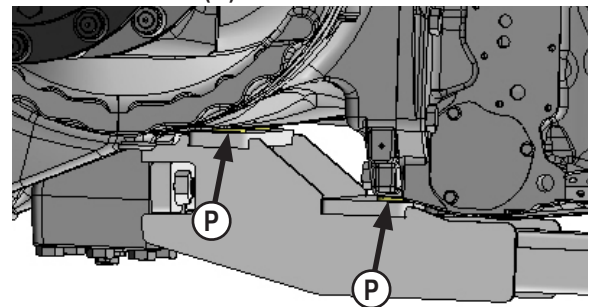
14. Rotate undercarriage mount into position. Use 12 - 7/8" x 1-3/4" bolts and 12 - 7/8" hardened flat washers to attach to front master plate installed in Step #9 (L).



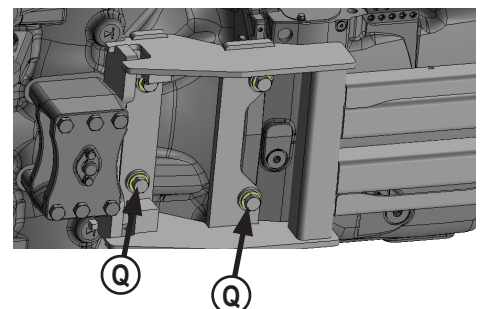
15. Raise rear of front undercarriage and install 2 - 3/4" hardened washers between front undercarriage and tractor frame at vertical bolt locations on front undercarriage (M).
16. Install 2 - 20mm x 80mm bolts, 2 - 3/4" hardened washers and 2 - 3/4" ID heavy washers in vertical bolt locations at rear of front undercarriage (N).
17. Center rear undercarriage under tractor.
18. Raise front of rear undercarriage.



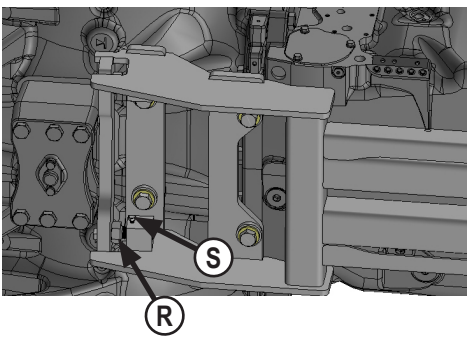
19. Attach rear undercarriage to front undercarriage with 4 - 3/4" x 2" bolts, 8 - 3/4" hardened washers and 4 - 3/4" center lock nuts (O).



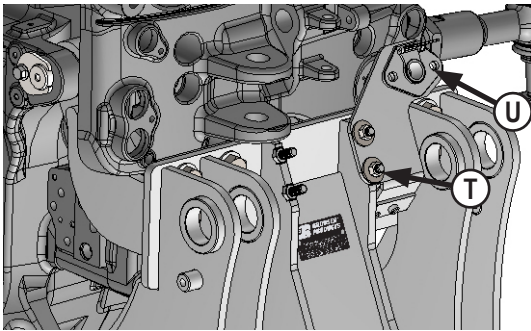
20. Raise rear of rear undercarriage.
21. Install 4 - 3/4" hardened washers between rear undercarriage and tractor frame at vertical bolt locations on front undercarriage (P).



22. Install 4 - 20mm x 80mm bolts, 4 - 3/4" hardened washers and 4 - 3/4" ID heavy washers in vertical bolt locations on rear undercarriage (Q).
23. Torque the 3/4" bolts (O) to 257 ft-lbs.
24. Torque front 10mm bolts (K) to 53 ft-lbs.
25. Torque front 7/8" bolts (L) to 600 ft-lbs.



26. Remove zip tie from rear push plate.
27. Evenly unscrew 1" bolts at rear of rear undercarriage until push plate is tight against drawbar bracket (R). Torque 1" bolts to 90-95 ft-lbs.
28. Install 2 - 5/16" x 3/4" bolts into blocks (S) at rear of rear undercarriage to lock 1" x 2" bolts. Torque the 5/16" bolts to 19 ft-lbs.
29. Torque vertical 20mm bolts (N & Q) to 432 ft-lbs.
30. Reinstall drawbar.



31. Attach the hose clamp bracket (T) to front of undercarriage mount with 2 - 1/2" flat washers and 2 - 1/2" nuts. .
32. If applicable, reattach the front electrical socket with 2 - 5/16" x 1-1/4" bolts, 2 - 1/4" washers, and 2 - 5/16" nyloc nuts to hose clamp bracket (U).
33. Reconnect the electrical socket wire connection to the tractor side wire harness.

34. Check the steering clearance at front undercarriage ears.

The minimum clearance between front undercarriage pin and tire should be about 1". If necessary, purchase steering stops from your local dealership.

35. Route hoses down channels on front and rear undercarriage. Secure them by using zip ties in holes along the hose channels.
36. Route the hoses to the back of the tractor. Stay above the drawbar and away from the PTO.
37. Plug the hoses into the open SCV's at the rear of the tractor.

Note: The installer is responsible to route hoses in a practical manner, to protect the hoses around sharp corners and moving objects, and secure hoses.

Warning: Fully oscillate the blade angle, tilt, steering, suspension and rear 3-point to check for adequate clearance.

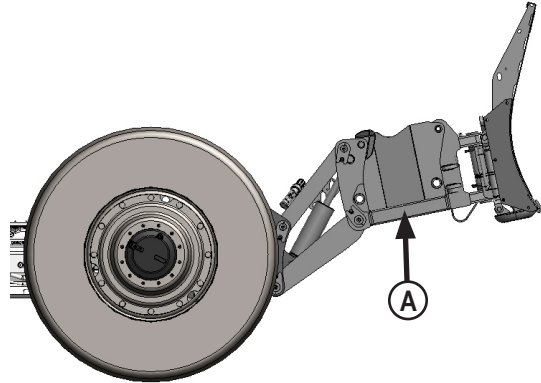
If necessary, purchase and install steering stops from your local dealership to avoid collision and subsequent damage. The minimum clearance between the front support pin and the tire should be 1".

The minimum clearance between any part on the blade and the front tires when the blade is fully angled, should be 3". If more clearance is necessary between the blade and front tires, call Grouser Products to purchase the extension on page #5.

Maintenance

1. After first 8 hours of use, re-torque all bolts.
2. Check all fasteners regularly to ensure proper operation of equipment.
3. Inspect all equipment for existing or potential damages every 10 hours or less.

Additional Extension



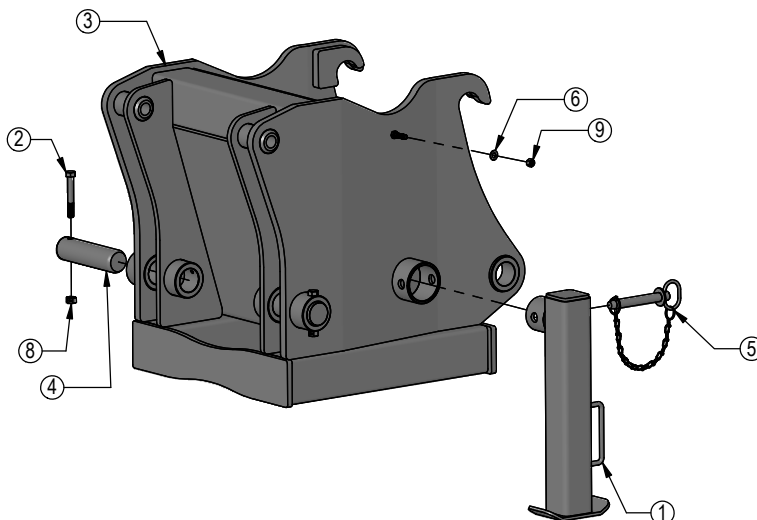
1. An additional extension (A) may be necessary if your tractor is equipped with front duals. Tire size and row spacing will determine if your system will require the extension.
2. All 650 and 710 dual front tire configurations require the extension.
3. Call Grouser with tire information to discuss if the extension is necessary for your system.

NOTE: Grouser Products is not responsible for damage to tires or blade if the extension is not installed.

NOTE: Front Dual Extension required if tractor is set up with the tire width of 150" or more on the 2-way, 4-way or 6-way blade.

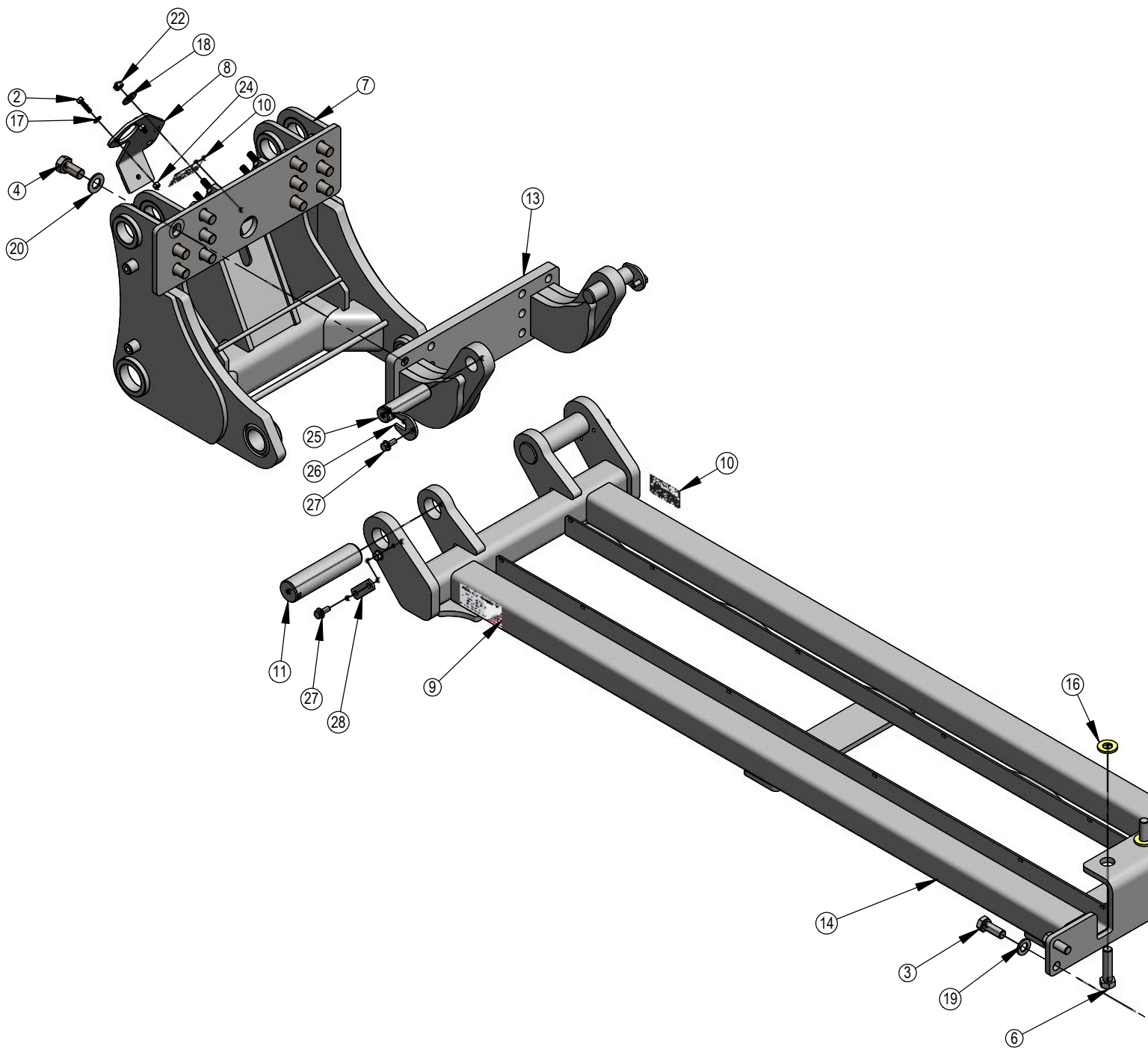
Extension Installation

1. If blade system is on the FH-440 lift system, disconnect the blade system from the FH-440 lift system.
2. Center and raise the extension until the top pins are fully engaged in the top hooks of the blade system.
3. Insert the lock out pins to attach the extension to the blade system.
4. Secure both lock out pins with 1/2" x 3-1/2" bolts and 1/2" lock nuts.
5. Position and attach the adapter stand in the down position as shown below.
6. Secure the hoses from the blade system to the left side of the extension with a cordura strap, 3/8" flat washer and 3/8" nyloc nut. Verify that all hoses have some slack to move when operating all of the blade functions.
7. Connect the extension with blade system to the FH-440 lift system.
8. Shut off the tractor engine and set the parking brake.
9. Pull the quick attach lock handle and lift the locking latch to lock the handle in place.
10. Clean hydraulic couplers and connect hydraulic couplers on the top arm. Refer to AG240 Dozer Owner's Manual and Parts Book for proper location of all functions.
11. Start tractor engine and raise lift system until the adapter stand is off the ground.
12. Shut off tractor engine and set parking brake.
13. Remove hitch pin with chain, rotate stand up and reattach with the pin.

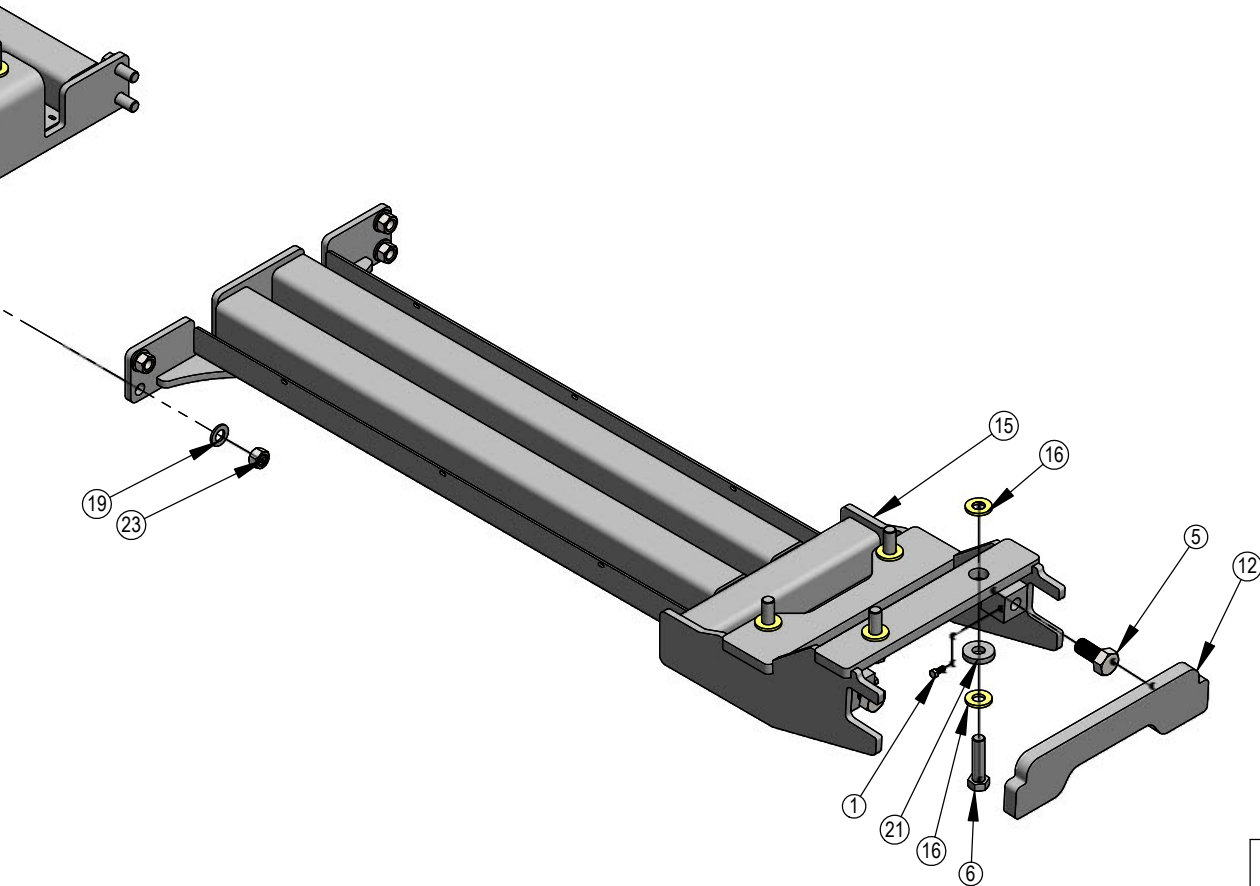
